# PALACES FOR THE PEOPLE EXHIBIT

### About

From 1882 to 1943, in 31 states and 6 countries, Rafael Guastavino and his son created more than 600 unique tile domes and vaultings that met his criteria of health, safety, and beauty. *Palaces for the People: Guastavino & America's Great Public Spaces* is an exhibition about the Guastavinos' life and works curated by MIT professor John Oschendorff. After the exhibit closed its run in the northeastern United States, it was donated to the Guastavino Alliance, which had it reprinted as a travelling exhibition. This exhibition is now available for loan to member organizations of the Guastavino Alliance.



### Specs

24 panels (4 groups of 6 panels each)

24 weighted wooden stands

20 reader rails and hardware

The 4 end panels are 48" x 93".

The other 20 panels are 31.5" x 93".

If they are displayed in a straight line they need at least 18 inches behind the panels. The reader rails protrude 12 inches from each panel. The panels do need to adjoin, but do not have to be displayed in a straight line. They can curve into corners. The most curved panel set we have set up is 144 inches across (compared to 205.5 inches across for a straight line display), which creates a space 67 inches deep inside the panels.
